RECYCLING OF SHINGLES

PROPOSALS DUE: Thursday, June 13, 2013, 2:00 PM. DUE DATE AND TIME ARE NOT CHANGED BY THIS ADDENDUM.

This Addendum is issued to modify, explain or clarify the original Request for Proposal (RFP) and is hereby made a part of the RFP. **Proposers must acknowledge all Addenda in their Proposal.**

PLEASE MAKE THE FOLLOWING CHANGES:

1. Award of multiple contracts and partial contracts.

Dane County reserves the right to award contracts to multiple proposers and to award contracts for specific elements of the of the bid form while excluding other items. Dane County may therefore award contracts for specific shingle types or choose to take responsibility for shipping material.

2. Shingle acceptance location

As stated in the RFP, Dane County may consider alternatives to storing shingles at the Rodefild landfill and trucking them to a recycling facility. Dane County will assess all elements of such Proposals, including the cost and revenue implications on Dane County's operations.

3. Recycling and reuse location

The Proposal should demonstrate a feasible, environmentally responsible, and sustainable plan for recycling of shingles. Whether shingles are recycled or reused in Dane County will have a minimal impact on the assessment of the Proposal. Proposers wishing to beneficially reuse material outside of Dane County will be given the same consideration as those beneficially reusing material exclusively within Dane County.

4. Loading of material

Dane County will provide labor and equipment to load contractor's vehicles for transport to contractor's facility.

5. Quantity of material

Dane County does not guarantee any minimum quantity of material for this contract. It is estimated that 15,000 to 20,000 tons of shingles are generated in Dane County. That is not an estimate of the quantity of shingles that would be received at the Dane County landfill. A local private shingle recycler in the area recently stopped recycling shingles, and this company informed Dane County that it had been processing 10,000 – 12,000 tons per year prior to ceasing operations.

6. Dane County Pricing

Dane County will strive to set its pricing for incoming shingles at a competitive rate in order to encourage customers to bring shingles to this site. Because the rate will be dependent on many market factors and on the pricing received as a result of this RFP, Dane County cannot state what that rate will be at this time.

7. Site Accommodations

Dane County is not specifying how much space it will make available for collection or storage of materials. It is the responsibility of the Proposer to visit the site and determine their approach to collecting, storing, shipping, and recycling shingles. Proposals should include all spacing and infrastructure requirements so Dane County can assess the operational feasibility of the Proposal.

8. Loading

Dane County can supply all labor and equipment necessary to load outbound vehicles with recyclable shingles.
